Dear Dr. Furukawa:

A letter from Dr. Smith came today confirming his part of the story firmly and specifically. I am sending it on to the teacher in Japan by registered mail today, with instructions to destroy it, explaining the legal implications.

Your letter was very helpful. I brought it back with me, and have it in my most personal file. I will not use it again except very discretely in the case of extreme emergency. Anne reports that you expressed some concern about it. If you wish, I will return it to you for you to keep in your files.

The community responsibility you and your colleagues demonstrated in this case has permitted us to terminate a nasty business. We are deeply grateful.
