Yesterday we had snow, but today the weather is fine. I went to the Immigration Office, 20 West Broadway, New York and met an officer.

As I wanted to do everything very legally, I explained to him all the situations of my coming to N.Y. According to the Immigration law, what I have to do is only reporting my addresses both here & old, to the Dep. of Justice. They are not interested what I do, or with whom I live, as long as I am a permanent resident, they only want to know WHERE I live. So, I reported my new address

very correctly & legally. Naturally what he said was exactly the same what the officer in the Immigration office in Hawaii told me.

I understand that you will be sponsoring a monk from Japan. I wish he well in his responsibilities & trust that your organization will benefit greatly from his services.

As I told you last Summer, we, Jōzan,  
Shūbin San, & myself will edit Senzaki Sensei's  
all manuscripts & publish it according to the request  
& encouragement of Saen Roshi. All of us think  
that this work must be done soon otherwise the  
manuscripts may be scattered. We need a strenuous  
work but we would like to do it inconspicuously.

I am sure you will understand this & cooperate  
to this meaningful work. When I was in Los Angeles,  
we talked this matter over, & I conveyed Saen Roshi's  
words to them. We made a plan that is: Jōzan  
starts reading as soon as the manuscripts arrives from  
Hawaii.

I hope you will kindly send two boxes (if my  
memory is correct, there were 2 boxes of ~~the~~ writing.  
Originally it was one, but after Mr. Child used them, he  
some how divided <sup>them</sup> into two) to

as soon as possible.

regards to you. He will stay in my Zendo every  
week end. Please convey my regards to Koko
