However, he is still free to teach and lecture as he pleases anywhere else. Thank you to all those who helped.

Previously, Eido Roshi's teaching was held hostage. Hopefully, soon it will be that, Soen Roshi's ashes, Nyogen Senzaki's ashes as well as the ashes of sangha members are no longer hostage, that Roshi is welcome at Dai Bosatsu Zendo, Kongo-ji and New York Zendo, Shobo-ji."

The page goes on to list the various dates that Eido Shimano will be "teaching." One of these will be held in Istanbul, Turkey. I half expect to see that Shimano will be heading overseas and setting up shop there soon, as his reputation here is forever damaged and tarnished. One can point the finger of blame everywhere else but the source all they want, but it will not lead to the reinstatement of someone who has committed such egregious actions during his tenure as a Zen teacher on American soil.

I really wanted to just laugh at it all, because it is all so poorly executed. If you want to get someone like Shimano back in the door, my suggestion would be to not make a website about it. Don't announce it!

One quote from the website goes as follows: "This page is to be in support of the people who love Eido Shimano Roshi. Because of a cross-cultural barrier, many people may feel bullied in hiding their love for him, in being quiet in their defense of him. What are we, except babies brainwashed at birth."

Goodness. My question would be: if you really do care about his well-being, like on the level of karma, what does it truly mean to love Eido? This is hard to read.

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


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
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
